Statistics

- i. The graduation rate in 2012 was as follows; Black students, 69%, Hispanic students, 73%, Asian students 88%, and Caucasian students, 86%.
- ii. 1.3 million High school students do not graduate.
- iii. 90% of new jobs and 85% of current jobs require some college or post-secondary education.
- iv. Roughly ½ of the students who enroll in a 4-year school receive their bachelor's degree in six years.
- v. Teacher quality is among the most significant factors that influence the achievement of the student.
